<input type="checkbox"/>	Ecosystem	A community of plants and animals that depend on each other to survive.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Equator	An imaginary line through the middle of the Earth that receives the most sunlight.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Canopy	Dense layer of trees overlapping each other. Home to most animals in the rainforest.
<input type="checkbox"/>	biomes	A biome is a large region of Earth that has a certain climate and certain types of living.
