



We Built This City!

Who built this city? We did!

We will be exploring many different types of buildings, how they were built and who they were built by.

Throughout this **Geography** based topic we will be exploring and learning lots of new information, not only about our own towns, cities and country, but about towns and cities around the world!



Subject Specific Vocabulary

City	A large town
Town	a built-up area with a name, defined boundaries, and local government, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city.
Village	A group of houses or buildings, smaller than a town in rural area.
Factory	A building or a group of buildings where goods are manufactured (made) mainly by machine.
Port	A town or city with a harbour or access to water where ships load or are unloaded
Harbour	A place on the coast where ships may moor for shelter
Rural	An area located outside cities and towns
Urban	A settlement with a large population and many buildings (a city or a town)
Continent	A continent is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents. In order from largest to smallest they are Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe and Australia.

Year 4: We Built This City

By the end of this unit what should pupils know?

- Know how to label key features of Manchester on an Ordnance Survey map using 6 figure grid references e.g. train station, cathedral, town hall.
- Know how to identify some of the larger countries in Europe on a map or globe: Russia, Germany, France, Italy, Spain, Sweden, Greece.
- Know the human features of a variety of UK regions, cities or counties
- Know how to plan a journey within the UK, using a road map
- Know why it is important to have natural resources available close to the site of a city: water, trees, rocks/clay, rivers or seas for fishing and arable land for farming/food production.
- Know and describe where cities are located in relation to their wider geographical context e.g. Paris is a city in the North of France, which is in Europe.
- Know and recognise all 7 of the world's continents by their shape.
