Topic, Autumn 2: 'Are we there yet?'

What the Indication Station told us...

Our Indication Station gives children the opportunity to explore, discuss, ask questions about and demonstrate their prior knowledge of an upcoming topic. We use the observations of the children around the Indication Station to determine what we will cover during the topic.

- The children were particularly interested in the helicopter
- They showed **some** knowledge of vehicles being used for rescue
- There were misconceptions about modes of transport boarding others eg, a car boarding a ferry, helicopter landing on a ship, seaplane landing in the sea.
- The children enjoyed making tunnels and bridges for their vehicles.
- Lots of children thought the Railroad Crossing Lights were traffic lights
- The children's railway vocabulary often linked to Thomas the Tank Engine.
- Some children were knowledgeable about the names and functions of building site vehicles.
- Children linked the aeroplane to travelling for a holiday.

- Ferries, seaplanes, channel tunnel.
- Helicopters and other flying vehicles
- Explore famous bridges and tunnels used by vehicles
