



Roman baths	A number of rooms designed for bathing, relaxing, and socialising, as used in ancient Rome.					

Important Places	
<b>Colosseum</b>	An oval amphitheatre in the centre of Rome which held up to 50,000 people.
<b>Hadrian's Wall</b>	A long wall built by the Romans across the north of England. It was to keep out the Scots. It is now one of Britain's most famous tourist attractions.
