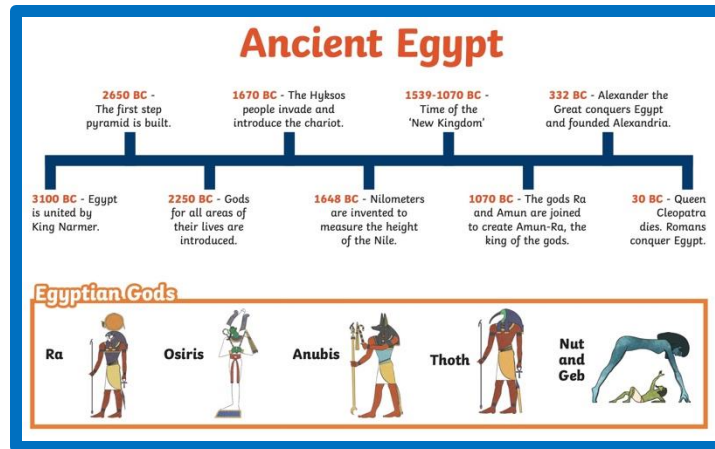


My World – The Earth (Year 6)

Vocabulary

Tutankhamen	He was an Ancient Egyptian Pharaoh.
Pharaoh	The monarchs of Ancient Egypt – the rulers.
Hieroglyphs	Formal writing used in Ancient Egypt.
Agriculture	The practice of farming.
Engineering	The process of creating and building structures by using Maths and Science.
Civilisation	A society with its own social organization (government, written records, cultures, beliefs).
Mummification	The method of embalming or treating the dead body.
Sarcophagus	A coffin mostly carved in stone.
