democracy	Democracy means 'rule by the people'. The people elect the government.
hoplite	A citizen soldier of the Ancient Greek city-state.
myth	Myths are old tales filled with magical creatures, gods and mystery
philosophy	It means 'love of wisdom' it is how we think.
artefacts	An item made by humans in the past
Parthenon	An Ancient Greek temple located in Athens, Greece.
Athenians	A citizen or resident of Athens.
Spartans	A citizen or resident of Sparta.
